

## Workforce Reentry Resource Links

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the Occupational Health and Safety Administration (OSHA) and the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) have provided guidelines regarding reentry to the workplace. These guidelines provide recommended actions so that employers can start planning to adapt to new workplace realities including appropriate physical distancing, supplying personal protective equipment, scheduling workflow, adjusting workplace ventilation, conducting workplace cleaning and disinfection, and more.

Workplace reentry information is available from CDC, OSHA and EEOC. Employers, however, are strongly encouraged to coordinate with state and local health officials so timely and accurate information can guide appropriate responses.
