### Personal Transportation Vehicle (PTV) Driving Dos and Don'ts



### Focus On Driving

- Do keep your eyes on where you are going
- Don't drive while using a cell-phone texting or talking
- Do use your mirrors when driving
- Don't focus on communicating with passengers
- Do take driving seriously
- Don't eat or drink while driving
- Do drive when well rested
- Don't drive intoxicated or while using medications that effect your ability to drive
- Don't adjust controls while driving



#### **Carrying Passengers**

- Do ask your passengers to wear a seatbelt (if available)
- Don't allow passengers to stand while moving
- Do take turns slowly
- Don't allow passengers to distract you
- Do limit passengers to one per seat
- Don't allow passengers to turn around in their seats
- Do ask your passengers to refrain from horseplay
- Don't transport intoxicated passengers
- Do ask passengers to keep their hands /feet in the vehicle at all times



#### **Carrying Loads**

- Do tie down loads properly
- Don't exceed load capacity
- Do be sure there is clear visibility when carrying a load
- Don't allow passengers to ride in the back with the load
- Do balance loads and place them towards the front of the vehicle
- Don't go up steep grades when carrying a load
- Do set your brake once you arrive at your destination
- Don't modify vehicles yourself to carry cargo modifications should be professionally installed
- Do follow unloading instructions for your vehicle
- Don't go fast in a loaded vehicle decrease your speed



#### **Driving Near Pedestrians**

- Do give pedestrians the right of way
- Don't drive into an area that is crowded with people
- Do drive very slowly near pedestrians
- Don't drive on sidewalks unless necessary
- Do use your horn to warn pedestrians when necessary
- Do watch for pedestrians exiting from buildings

# Personal Transportation Vehicle (PTV) Driving Dos and Don'ts



### **Driving at Night**

- Do drive vehicles at night that have headlights
- Don't drive at night unless necessary
- Do turn on your lights early morning, dusk, when raining, or at night
- Don't drive on , or cross over regular roads at night ,even equipped as a slow-moving vehicle
- Do drive with extra caution, especially near pedestrians



#### Driving Unpaved Areas / Off-Road

- Do drive on paved routes when possible
- Don't use vehicles off-road that are not designed for it
- Do stay alert for bumps, holes, rocks, tree limbs and other hazards
- Don't stop or start suddenly when going up or down hills
- Do drive straight up and down slopes rather than at an angle
- Don't drive on manicured lawns unless necessary



### Driving on Regular Roads (Roads with standard speed limits)

- Do obey all traffic laws
- Don't drive PTVs on regular roads if they are not equipped as Slow-Moving Vehicles, or if they don't meet requirements (SMVs)
- Don't drive on a regular road unless necessary
- Do pull over and let faster vehicles pass when necessary
- Don't drive on off-campus roads at dusk or in the dark
- Do drive with your headlights and warning light on to increase visibility
- Don't drive without your license



## Parking Your Vehicle

- Do park in designated parking spots for PTVs when possible
- Don't obstruct building entrances, sidewalks, or paths
- Do engage the parking brake after turning off the engine
- Don't forget to take the key with you
- Do lock or secure the vehicle if that is an option



#### Driving in Parking Lots

- Do keep your eyes open for cars with drivers sitting in them or cars preparing to back out
- Don't drive in parking lots unless necessary
- Do use your horn to warn cars of your presence if they start backing out
- Don't drive in parking lots when it is raining, at dusk, or night-time
- Do drive slower than usual in parking lots (5 mph)
